

Religious leaders call for promoting interfaith harmony



ISLAMABAD: Representative of Pope Francis over Interfaith World Dialogue and Harmony in South Asia Prof Szabolcs Anzelm Szuromi met Allama Dr Shabbir Hasan Maisami, central secretary general, Shia Ulema Council of Pakistan, and discussed measures to curb hate-based extremism in Pakistan.

The two sides discussed the global religious and political situation and called for promotion of inter-religious harmony as this was the need of the hour. Both leaders condemned hate-based extremism as it was the basis of violent actions by fanatics.

Prof Szuromi emphasised on the importance of promoting interfaith understanding through dialogue, as an essential effort for world peace and humanity's survival.

He also stressed on the importance of socialising between members of various faiths as a way to develop interactions and reduce misconceptions against each other.

"We need to eradicate the trend of disrespecting each other's holy places as it was not allowed by any religion," he added.
